

Zero Food Poverty, Zero Waste.

Kaibosh is coming to Kapiti

Kaibosh Food Rescue is establishing a third base to service Kapiti and Horowhenua districts (it currently operates in Wellington and in Lower Hutt.) Kaibosh was established to rescue and redistribute food. Founded in 2008 by Robyn and George Langlands. It began out of the absurd problem; quality food was going to waste while many people in the Wellington community were going hungry. The story of how Kaibosh became New Zealand's first food rescue organization and grew into a thriving charity, rescuing and redistributing thousands of kilos of food each month can be found at https://www.kaibosh.org.nz/

The plan is to establish Kaibosh at the community hub at 6 Tongariro Street, Paraparaumu in 2020. Supermarkets and other food businesses are coming on board as well as volunteers to 'make it all happen'. Volunteers are being asked to give two hours a fortnight. You may volunteer as an individual or a group. If you are interested or know of someone who would like to be involved please email me marg.lees0@gmail.com and I will keep you informed of updates.

Public Issues Update

In October we were privileged to have a visit from Betsan Martin from the Methodist Church Public Issues group. Betsan spoke on issues related to water, particularly in Canterbury and Horowhenua where our lakes and rivers have borne the brunt of devastating actions which have left the water and surrounding environment in a distressed state. From the policy level down this has been allowed to happen with the focus on monetary gains rather than long term environmental consequences.

Recently the government has been asking New Zealanders for their views on proposals to stop freshwater health getting worse and to restore waterways to a healthy state in a generation. Betsan and her team have prepared a submission on Fresh Water which was due to go to the Ministry for the Environment on October 31. For further information go to https://submissions.mfe.govt.nz


